MY CHECKLIST

ATTEND A NURSING INFORMATION SESSION

COMPLETE AN EDUCATIONAL PLAN WITH A COUNSELOR

- Discuss your specific Nursing path.

VISIT THE SUCCESS CENTERS

EXPLORE CAREER PATHS

REVIEW MAJOR PREPARATION

SEE A COUNSELOR

- Prepare to apply for the ADN and/or BSN programs.

APPLY TO THE ADN PROGRAM IN MARCH OR SEPTEMBER

- Fill out an ADN Multi Criteria Evaluation Request Form 6 weeks prior to application period.

UPDATE TRANSFER APPLICATIONS

- Submit required documents to the transfer institutions.

VISIT THE CAREER CENTER

- Go to the Career Center for job search strategies, resume assistance, and interview preparation.

*English and Mathematics placement relies on high school performance data. Direct placement into transfer-level English (ENGL 1A) and Mathematics (for quantitative reasoning) provides the most efficient path to a degree or certificate.
