7.1 President

- Accreditation Update
 - The Focused Site Visit went very well. The Peer Review Team had no recommendations for Chaffey.
 - The Peer Review team will write a report, provide it to Dr. Shannon to review for accuracy, then file with ACCJC.
 - ACCJC will review the report at their January 2024 meeting, then a formal letter and ACCJC's decision will be shared with Chaffey.
- President's Cabinet Meeting September 19, 2023
 - CJUHSD MOU Signing Event happening Tuesday September 26 at the Governing Board meeting.
 - Fraudulent Registration Activity update (courtesy of Jim Fillpot)
 - 4,928 total enrollments suspected of being highly likely to be fraudulent
 - Enrollment records generated by 1,434 "bad actors"
 - At the initial point of detection represented, represented approximately 8.2% of all enrollments (statewide estimate: 20%)
 - 48-hour process provides real students with an opportunity to verify their active status
 - Fraudulent records removed initiated in three waves:
 - Traditional 14-week term removed on August 30 (1,731 records)
 - First week start (full-term, early 14-week, 1st Fast Track) removed on September 6th (1,599 records)
 - 2nd Fast Track removed on September 8th (1,598 records)
 - 2nd Fast Track wait list as of 9/18 only 15 suspected fraudulent enrollments
 - BP 7125 passed at the President's Cabinet. AP 7125, BP 7270 & AP 7270 were not included on the September agenda.

 - Turning Point is an inmate education program where inmates receive instruction and support. Rising Scholars is formerly incarcerated and system impacted. The grant requires full-time leadership in the program, however, Senator Martinez is currently only on a 50% reassignment for this leadership. Athalie Sapp is a part-time faculty member over Rising Scholars. The program recently moved from Instruction to Student Services, however, this is an Instructional Program. Solutions include hiring a Director, Faculty Coordinator at each site, and four Human Resources staff. Senator Martinez wants the help of the Academic Senate by being aware of the issues.

Scope: This committee is open to all faculty, staff, and administrators, as well as select students. The committee will:





Items that are classified as "supplies" for the course are not within the framework definition of ZTC.

Example: If the course uses OER material for the textbook alongside a "kit" that must be purchased, that course can be listed as ZTC-B on the course search.


Textual Resources vs. Course Supplies

Course supplies, such as lab kits, art kits, yoga mats, etc. are not within the framework definition of ZTC.

Myth Busting

- Having a ZTC Degree does not mean every course in department needs to be ZTC.
- ZTC Degree courses should be roughly 85-90% of course offerings outliers can remain.
- Low-Cost Textbook pricing must include the average cost of the textbook from all sellers

 including Campus Store, and suppliers such as Chegg, Amazon, etc. for new, used, and
 rental copies.
- Campus Store pricing on textbook materials does include overhead cost to support labor to house, rehouse, and distribute texts. The Campus store does not profit from textbook distribution to students.
- ZTC/OER Material can be requested to be bound and printed at the Campus Store, and still be listed as ZTC. Students can receive individualized quotes on costs by contacting the Campus Store.


