- The Senate recommended President DeRose to attend the Library Meeting on 8/29/2024.

8. UNFINISHED BUSINESS *10 minutes max

8.1. Discussion Item: Academic Senate discussion of the Fall 2024 Convocation update regarding the MacKenzie Scott gift. See attachment titled, “Compilation of Academic Issues Group Notes, Academic Senate Minutes, and Convocation Fall 2024 regarding MacKenzie Scott gift”

- The Accounting and Budgeting Department was not aware of the recent decisions to spend the MacKenzie Scott money before the Convocation presentation but were expected to create expenditures. There have been recent transfers from the MacKenzie Scott money to other accounts. These transfers were meant to pay back expenditures from other accounts. Transferring costs after the fact implies that it was not part of the original plan.
- Senators inquired that if the Administration is taking actions behind our back what are the repercussions?
- There is \$2.6-2.7 million not accounted for in the Convocation presentation. We would like to see documentation for the unrestricted spending finds.
- At the April Governing Board meeting, the Academic Senate requested to be involved in the decisions for spending the MacKenzie Scott money. This request has not been recognized. We are engaged on campus, care about students, and want to be involved in the decisions for this money.

- Why was the Classified Senate and Student Government not given any money? Transparency is an issue. The college is being led without enough consultation so should we reject the money being given to the Academic Senate?
- The Administration is holding \$20 million for the President of the college to decide how to spend it. MacKenzie Scott directly and specifically said the money was to be used for students.
- If we accept the funds, we do not know what the conditions and consequences will be for using the funds. Will plans for the money need to be approved by the Executive Team?
- Textbook costs and parking permits could be a good use of the money.
- Since decisions are being made without allowing faculty participation in planning, faculty lack trust in the Administration and don't see a good faith approach. Senators expressed their lack of confidence in effective leadership.
- Senators will come back to this discussion next week with a possible motion.

9. NEW BUSINESS *10 minutes max per item

9.1 Discussion Item: Debrief following the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) August 13 visit. Strategic Planning to improve effective participation and collegial consultation of the Academic Senate

- Senators expressed their appreciation for ASCCC coming to support and empower us. Senators found it valuable and informative.
- The AP 2510 workgroup began working on including students. Their goal is to sunshine their findings by the end of the academic year.
- Senators can look at governing handbooks from other colleges, like Citrus College, Cerritos College, and Clovis College. Do we want to partner with the Classified Senate and Student Government to propose a governing handbook?
- We need a governing handbook to include a way to improve committee communication. A master calendar is needed so we know when committees meet. A central repository housed on the portal or website is needed for updates and announcements. We could also use slack or the Chaffey app for college announcements.
- Club and committee members could check-in during Academic Senate meetings via public comment. Club and committee members can also take back the information learned at the Academic Senate meeting to their clubs and committees so everyone is in the loop.
- Next week Senators are to be prepared to bring a motion for the work they would like to see the Academic Senate take on for this semester to improve effective participation and governance across the college.

(6) Parking Fees

- Possibly offsetting student parking fees with faculty and staff stipends. Alisha stated that a stipend amount would not cover the cost of Police and Parking Services. This concept would also need to be approved by both unions because it is a working condition.
- Currently, most (68%) students parking fees are covered through California Promise
 - Liz Encarnacion suggested that advertisements towards parking fees returning could be partnered with information on how to mitigate parking fees through day passes or applying for CA Promise for self-advocacy in terms of lowering parking fees. Nicole DeRose added on to suggest perhaps the CCSJ could support that communication to students as well.
 - Angela Burk-Herrick suggested a marketing campaign of “sponsoring a student permit” to help improve student equity. Laura Hope stated that could fit within a current model of “meaningful incentives” in regards to the McKenzie Scott Gift uses. Alisha Rosas also mentioned the Panther Promise could be an alternative way to help support and offset student costs through the Foundation.
- Neil Watkins brought forward the concern that Marketing and Financial Aid did not

- The VPAS expressed appreciation for Superintendent/President Dr. Shannon's email regarding the taskforce for undocumented students and what the Mackenzie Scott gift is going to do for the undocumented student population. The ASSSSC shared that perhaps providing a list of the upcoming projects, the marketing of these projects and how much funding will be allocated to these funds, possibly \$500,000-\$700,000. PAS suggested that another town hall be held to share this information.

Academic Senate requests access to review the budget allocations and plans related to the MacKenzie Scott Gift \$25 million donation.

Faculty are eager to understand how these funds are being utilized to further student equity at Chaffey College. Transparency around budgeting and resource allocation is important, and reviewing this information on regular and consistent intervals would help stakeholders better appreciate the impact of the continued equity initiatives. In addition, the Academic Senate requests further participatory involvement in the planning of how these funds are utilized, having active representation from all stakeholders.

Academic Senate requests the following information no later than April 30, 2024:

- A detailed breakdown of how the \$25 million donated amount is being allocated across different programs, departments, or initiatives
- Projected timelines and milestones for the utilization of remaining funds
- Any plans or strategies for leveraging this [donation/funding] to secure additional resources or support
- Initiate a workgroup tasked with providing recommendations for the allocation of funds. This workgroup should be comprised of at least one representative for all Equity-focused groups on campus, representatives from Student Government,
