- **9.1 Action Item:** Academic Senate Representation and Constitutional Amendments. See attachment titled, "Academic Senate Representation Item, January 16, 2024"
- More amendments are needed due to inconsistencies in our constitution. See attachment for details.
- Senators discussed Options 1 and 2 for senate representation:
 - o If senators choose Option 1 then no further constitutional amendment will be needed.
 - There are many unanswered questions with Option 2 and numerous additional amendments to the constitution will be needed.
 - Twenty year review of representation shows that the Senate has always followed the organizational chart when schools/units changed or departments/programs were moved around.
 - Senator Estrata compared the representation in Option 1 to the US Senate and Option 2 to the House of Representatives.
 - President DeRose reminded senators that the Academic Senate does not represent specific programs. The <u>10+2</u> is broad. Do larger ACCs need more representation?
 - Senator DePonte added that while the smaller groups might feel their voices are being lost in Option 1, individual voices can be lost in large groups as well.
 - Senator Gomez shared that faculty struggle with having time to attend in-person, which would lead to an issue with increasing representation. PCS is a large ACC, how will all of the voices be heard?
- Motion for Approval Vice President Encarnacion moved to choose Option 1. Senator Chamberlain seconded the motion. The motion was not approved. 1.16.24, 9Y/11N/2A.
- Curriculum Chair Burk-Herrick mentioned that every time there is a reorganization or a department change, the Senate will have to debate this all over again and rewrite our constitution.

- Senator Holdiness suggested, if we go with Option 2, we could write the constitution to allow for those kinds of changes.
- **Motion for Approval** Senator Estrada moved to present only Option 2 for a vote to the electorate. Senator Henry seconded the motion. The motion was not approved. 1.16.24, 2Y/20N/0A.
- Senator Chamberlain said we should let the electorate vote on both options.
- Senator Nazar asked if there will be pros and cons for each option given to the electorate. President DeRose said we can use the feedback list and hold an open forum.
- **Motion for Approval** Senator Chamberlain moved to allow the electorate to choose between two options. Senator Boboye seconded the motion. The motion was approved. 1.16.24, 20Y/1N/1A.

Facilities Master Plan Update

Architect/consultant team on board to assess post-pandemic student enrollment data and future space needs. Draft plan completion and board presentation expected May 2024.

Chino Campus Instructional Building

Project in construction. Nearing completion on exterior substrate; installation of interior walls; and mechanical, electrical and plumbing (MEP). Fiber lines to be installed soon. Rough ductwork for HVAC has been installed with some HVAC units ready for installation on the roof. Exterior grading to start next month.

FONTANA CAMPUS



New Fontana Campus Phase 1

Interviews scheduled for design-build entities (DBE) in mid-January. The evaluation team will review and make their selection. Preconstruction and design development for campus buildings to follow with the selected DBE after award of a contract.

ONTARIO CAMPUS



Ontario Campus Master Plan

The Master Plan for the new Ontario Campus was approved at the December 14, 2023 Governing Board meeting. Next steps are procurement of criteria architect and CEQA consultants.


RANCHO CUCAMONGA CAMPUS



ADA Barrier Removal

Project in construction for site work at the Rancho Cucamonga campus. Current work in process at 8 locations, including: C1.2B (Lot 4), C2.1B (VSS Bldg.), C5.0A (Between HS & PS, 3 locations in this area), C7.1A (Tennis Courts), C7.2A, C7.2B, and C7.2C (all 3 at stadium).

RANCHO CUCAMONGA CAMPUS (continued)



Swimming Pool Renovation

Project in construction. Steel wall framing, electrical, and plumbing work are ongoing. Masonry wall construction has started on the east side for the pool equipment, storage, and chemical rooms. Concrete pours for footings for new bleachers to begin soon.



Boiler Retrofit

Project in construction in multiple locations including: Library, Social Science, Center for the Arts E, Center for the Arts B, Student Services/Administration, and Vocational Education.



MACC Reno & Addition

Bid award schedule to start next week. Contractor to tentatively start construction in mid-April. Swing space activities as follows: Student Government moved to CCE last summer. Over winter break EOPS moved to AD-151, cafeteria food prep moved to CDC-B, and food services moved to the Sports Center. Over spring break Student Health Services will move to CDC-A.




Library Learning Commons

Academic Senate Representation Item, January 16, 2024

Proposed Constitutional Amendments, Spring 2024

<u>January 9, 2024 Academic Senate meeting amendment to change the</u>
<u>representative description.</u> This amendment was proposed by Academic Senate at the January 9 meeting. The amendment will be put out to the Electorate for voting, date TBD.

• Article IV Section 1: The Academic Senate as authorized in Title 5, section 53201 and 53202*2 shall be composed of two elected representatives, each with staggered two-year terms, from each school and unit, three elected members-at-large for three-year terms, two members-at-large representing the adjunct faculty for two-year terms, the President for a two-year term plus one preceding year as President-Elect for a total of three years, and the Chair of the Curriculum Committee for a two-year term.

Constitutional Amendments to correct inaccuracies

- Article VI: There is no section 4. This article jumps from section 3 to section 5. Update section 5 to section 4, and section 6 becomes section 5.
- a. Article IV Section 5c: Members of the faculty may attend any meeting of the Academic Senate. Individuals who are not members of the Chaffey College faculty are welcome to attend any open Senate meeting. However, the Sente may close any meeting or portion thereof to all but members of the Electorate by a majorty vote of the attending Senators. NOTE: This is a Brown Act violation. Academic Senate may not close any portion of the meeting for any reason. Closed sessions are reserved for litigation and employment discussions, neither of which fall under Academic Senate purview.
- Article V Section 3.3: If a vacancy or resignation occurs during a Senate officer's member's term of office, an election shall may be held to fill the remainder of the term. (Following the appropriate procedure).
- Article V Section 8 (last sentence): Likewise, the Secretary-Treasurer of the senate shall be elected from within and by the membership of the Senate for a one-year term of office beginning July 1. Voting shall be by secret ballot unless a candidate for an office is unopposed in which case the nominee is elected by acclamation. NOTE: This is a Brown Act violation. Any voting that takes place during Academic Senate meetings must be recorded publicly.

Constitutional Amendment to change representation

Option 1. Aligns with the current practice of equal representation for each unit.

- Two senators plus an alternate per unit.
- **No Constitutional amendment needed:** With the Constitutional amendment to Article IV, Section 1 this would become the representation structure if Option 2 is not selected.

Option 2. Allows for representation based on size of an area/unit.

- Number of senators is dependent upon the number of departments within an ACC.
- Based on feedback received from ACC/Area meetings, there are questions about this model that remain unanswered. (See end of this document for the compiled feedback).
- Requires additional Constitutional Amendments (if this representation is selected):

- Article IV Section 2: For the purpose of providing Senate representation, each educational unit or school shall elect **two** senators.
 - Need language to address the number of senators for ACCs with three senators
 - Need language to address the number of senators for ACCs with four senators
- Article V Section 3: A senator shall be elected to a **two (2) year term of office** beginning on July 1, with the following exceptions:
 - Senators-at-Large, who shall be elected to a three (3) year term of office.
 - Alternate Senators (see Section 4 and Section 5) shall be elected for a term of office which shall not exceed two years.
 - Unanswered questions:
 - How long will alternate senator terms be? The same, regardless of the number of senators?
 - Will the alternate term length change if the ACC has three senators?
 - Will the alternate senator term length change if the ACC has four senators?
 - If a vacancy or resignation occurs during a Senate officer's term of office, an election shall be held to fill the remainder of the term. (Following the appropriate procedure).
 - Already addressed in the correct inaccuracies proposed amendment (see above).
- Article V Section 4: Each unit shall elect **two** Senators and **up to two** Alternate Senators. The Vice President or President-Elect of the Senate shall notify each unit of an election not later than 60 days before the end of the Spring semester. The senator whose term is not expiring shall administer its election. The election shall be completed no later than thirty days before the end of the Spring semester. Absentee ballots shall be provided to those unit members who are unable to vote in person.
 - As with Article V, Section 3 this article will need revisions.

Compiled Representation Feedback

- Can the senate provide a list of pros and cons for both option 1 & option 2?
- Counseling, will they have less representation than all the other areas? Is that fair?.There are a lot of counselors.
- There have been very large school and very small schools. Two senators seems to have been working. What evidence suggests that a large ACC is losing out on representation which would require an increase in representation?
- If the number of senators increases because an ACC has more programs than other ACCs, then the larger ACCs will have a larger voice in Academic Senate than other ACCs.
- If an ACC has vacancies now and faculty don't want to fill the positions, why would those ACCs be offered more spots like in Option 2?
- The 10+2 are broad academic areas of faculty purview, nothing related specifically to programs. Increasing the number of senators for ACCs with lots of programs suggests that programs are in need of faculty representation. If the 10+2 are not program specific, why would ACCs with more programs need more representation?
- For ACCs with three senators, will the senator terms for those ACCs become three years instead of two years?
- How long will the terms be for ACCs with four senators? Do two expire one year, and the other two expire another year?
 - Only the FT Senator-At-Large terms are for three years, staggered. All other terms are two years, and are staggered.

- o If, the terms are changed to three years for ACCs with three senators, the following areas of the Constitution will require amendments:
 - Article IV Section 1
 - Article IV Section 2
 - Article V Section 3
 - Article V Section 4

Other feedback (from the Jan. 9meeting):

Representation of part-time faculty in the second example, in the second model which is based on population size, the adjunct faculty are approximately 700. Possible increase up to four senators. Not based on people, but departments.

If the number of seats increases, the quorum also goes up.

There is general confusion about what the representation was for, like why we need Academic Senate?

Several schools that merged into one. HW for example. ACD is another example.

Academic Senate Resolution- Action Plan for Increasing Library Staffing in Accordance with Title 5

Whereas, the Academic Senate of California Community Colleges supports that "Librarians are central to education as they provide a safe and inclusive environment for students to bring questions about their courses, explore new ideas, and learn to become information literate in a quickly changing world," [1] and research indicates library resources and instruction are related to improved student success and retention;

Whereas Chaffey College BP4040 states that the district will provide "library and learning support services that are an integral part of the institution's educational program" [2];

Whereas the ASCCC Standards of Practice for California Community College Library Faculty and Programs states, "The library is an educational facility [...] as such, it cannot operate without library faculty in place. A library, like a classroom, should not be in use unless library faculty are available to provide service and facilitate student learning" [3];

Whereas Chaffey College libraries have not been staffed in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 5, §58724 [4] for at least 10 years, which sets forth the minimum staffing levels for certificated and classified staffing in libraries and media centers, and that the minimum number of staff for a library serving 13,000 FTES is 15.0 staff while Chaffey College Libraries have 5.5 staff;

Whereas libraries are required to have a certificated librarian present during all hours the library is open by Chaffey College AP 4040 [5], California Education Code [6], and the ASCCC Standards of Practice for California Community College Library Faculty and Programs [3];

Whereas Chaffey College Administrative Procedure 4040 states that Chaffey College Library will comply with the California Code of Regulations [5];

Whereas Chaffey College is continually growing to include new locations, buildings, and services that need to be adequately staffed per regulations;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Academic Senate advocates for an action plan to reach district compliance with the library staffing minimum standards set forward in California Code of Regulations, title 5, §58724; such an action plan should be created by a work group established by March 2024 which is comprised of library managers, library faculty, and library staff, with said action plan finalized no later than October 2024;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Academic Senate recommends that the district hire an additional 2.0 FTE classified library clerk II positions by Fall 2024 to work in good faith towards said compliance;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Libraries will not be opened nor remain open unless at least one (1) classified library clerk and one (1) library faculty are concurrently present in the building in accordance with said California regulations, CCC policies, and Chaffey College procedures.
