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David Rentz Music/ACD Spring 2025 Sabbatical Leave Request

Purpose

The purpose of my sabbatical leave is to achieve professional growth as both an advisor/mentor for current Chaffey music students and as a composer of choral music.

Through my time spent embedded in regional choral/vocal music and music education programs, attendance at one or more music education conferences, and subsequent development of a comprehensive guide to local/regional transfer options for Chaffey music students, I expect to increase my effectiveness as an advisor/mentor to students intending to pursue careers in the field.

I am an experienced composer, with over 15 works performed by ensembles across the United States (including one by the Chaffey Chamber Choir at last year's Report to the Community)! But it has been a very long time since I've been able to devote extended, focused time to composing, and I expect that doing so during so during my sabbatical will help me strengthen and deepen my craft.

Objectives and Activities

The objectives of my proposed sabbatical activities are to help me grow professionally and to enhance and strengthen my educational program (music). My integrated activities and objectives are:

- 1a. Become more familiar with Southern California four-year (bachelors-granting) choral/vocal music and music education programs, the institutions that house them, and the faculty who run them by spending day-long residencies with several of them (e.g. CSUF, CSULB, University of Redlands, and comparable institutions), meeting with faculty and staff, attending rehearsals, etc. These would be organized directly by me I would contact and arrange to spend a day "in residence" with each program, attending rehearsals, classes, and lessons, and speaking to instructors and students.
- 1b. Attend at least one state and/or national choral music education conference, e.g. California All-State Music Education Conference (15-18 Jan 2025; Sacramento) and/or American Choral Directors Association National Conference (18-22 March 2025; Dallas, TX), learning about new trends in instruction, technology, and DEIA, as well as staying current in professional pathways and practices relevant to Chaffey students.
- 1c. Organize my newly-acquired knowledge in an easily-accessed and -updated format that can be shared with current and future Chaffey students (likely a multi-section cloud-based document). As an instructor who teaches the only section of a class that all Music AA-T degree-seekers are required to take (Music 58), I will provide all of the music majors in the class access to the cloud-based document and offer them advising based on the information they review.

- 1d. Longer term (post-sabbatical) objective: to use both the knowledge and document above to advise and mentor Chaffey music students more effectively.
- 1e. Measurable outcome: Meet with every transfer applicant in vocal music (usually 8-12 per academic year) and advise them, using this tool as a reference.
- 2a. To compose a set of at least three choral works setting texts by Chaffey instructors, staff, and/or students, of a difficulty level appropriate to the Chaffey Chamber Choir by soliciting

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such texts from colleagues and students and then setting them to music and engraving (i.e. notating) them.

2b. Longer term (post-sabbatical) objective: to increase my visibility as a composer and give the students the opportunity to see the development of new work in action.

2c. Measurable outcome: Perform and record the pieces with the Chamber Choir.

Ongoing access to more detailed and comprehensive transfer options in my educational program, as well as to an advisor/mentor with a deeper base of knowledge.
