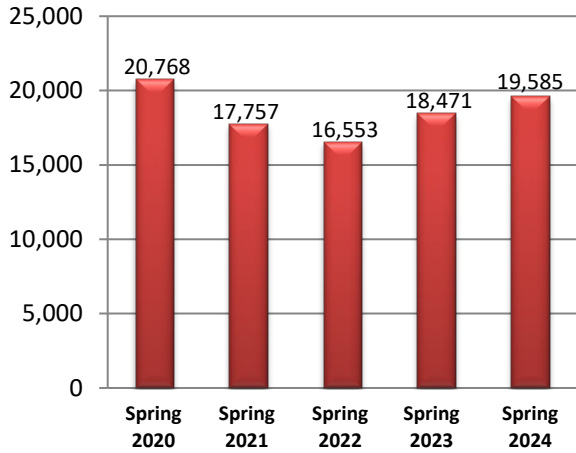

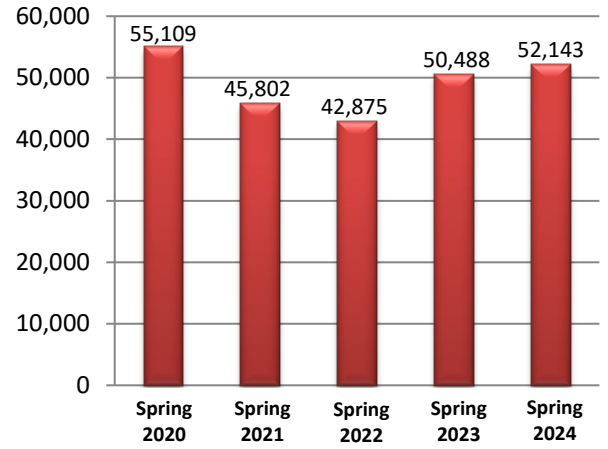
Unduplicated Student Headcount



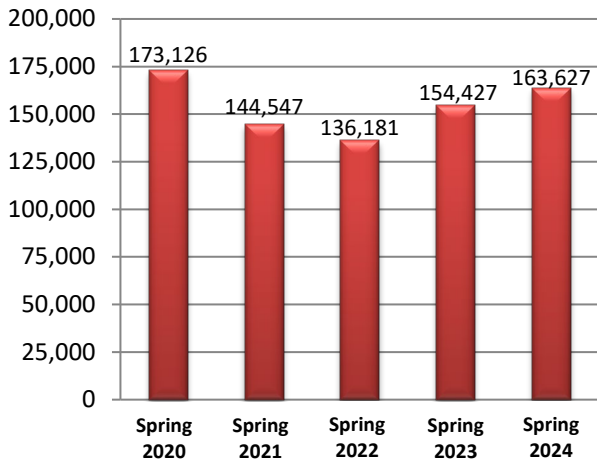

Number of Credit Enrollments



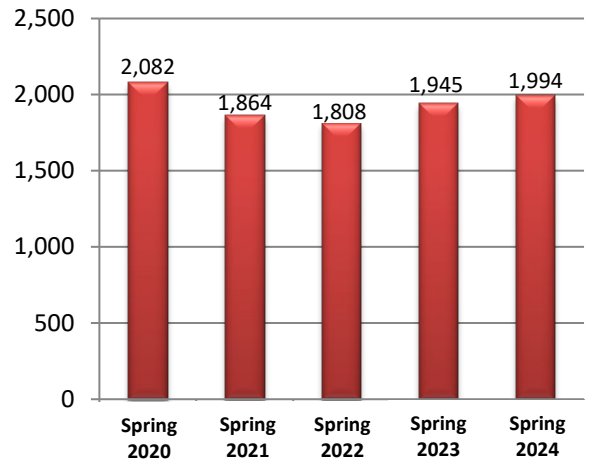
Total Credit Units Attempted



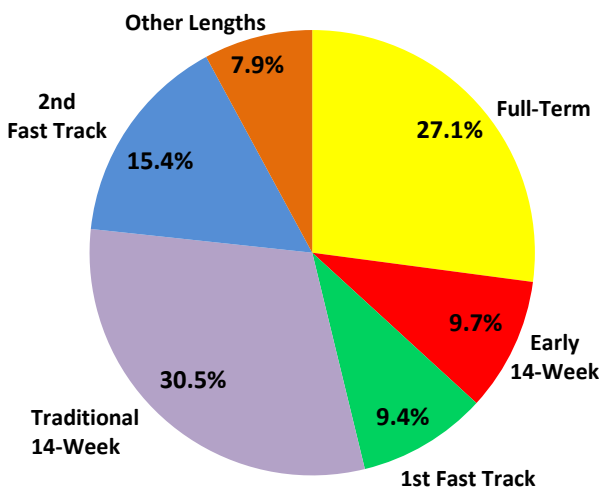

Number of Credit Sections Offered

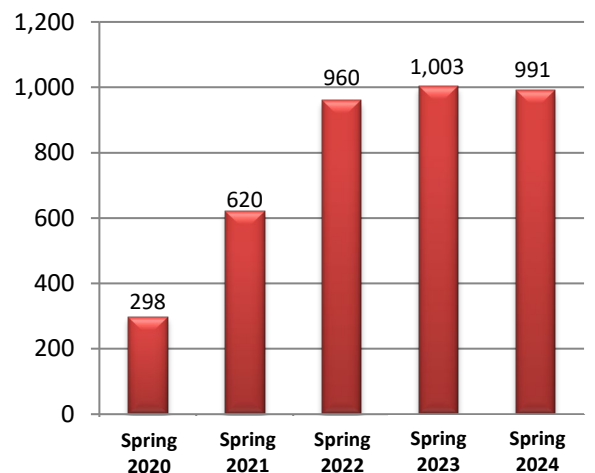


Section Distribution by Session Length

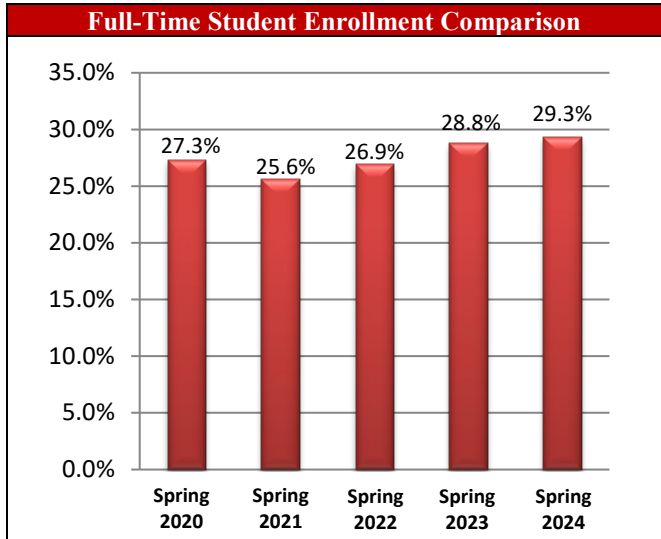

Number of Late Start Sections

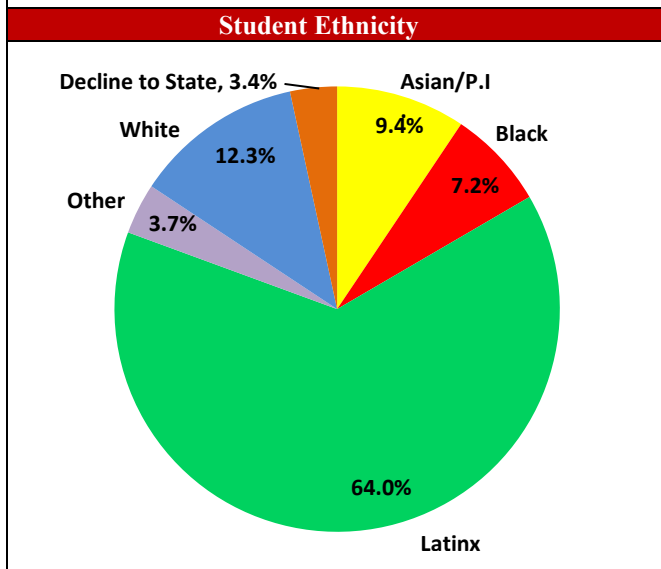
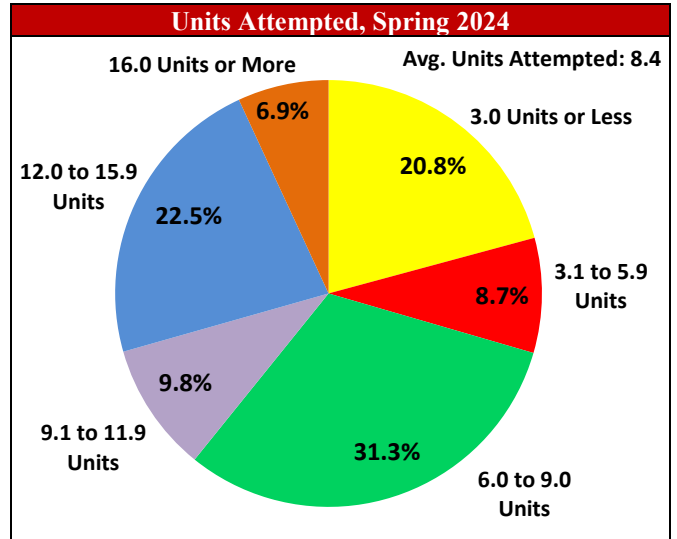


Spring 2024 Semester First Census Credit Enrollment Data



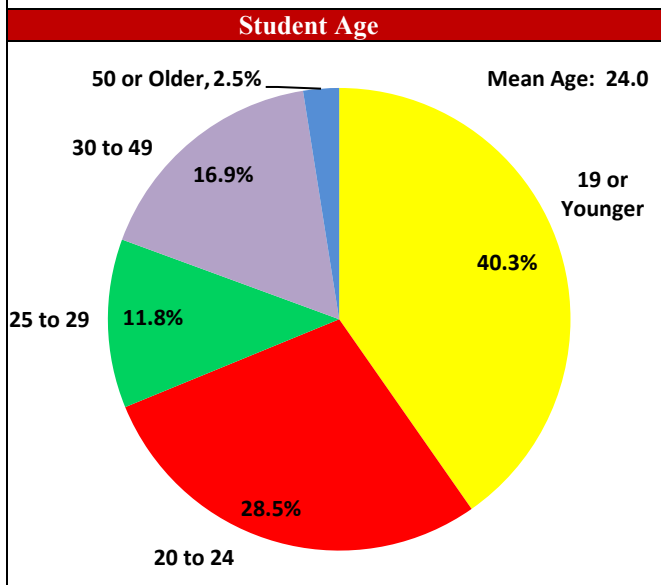
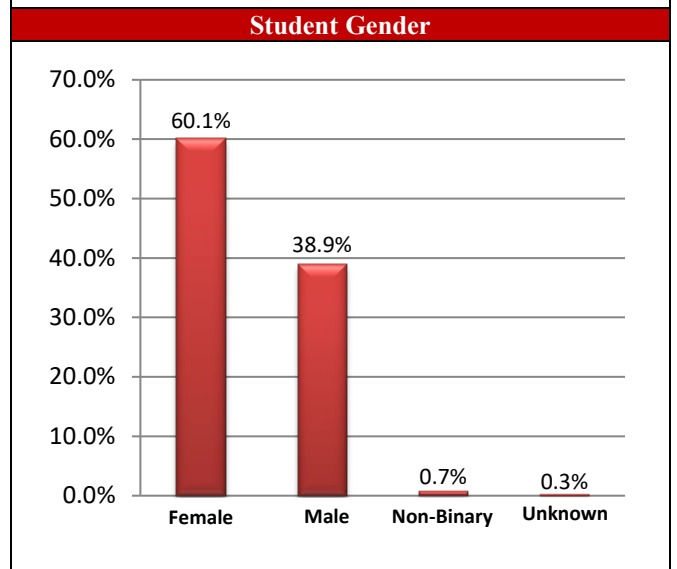
← 5,747 students are enrolled full-time, an 8.0% increase over last spring. This also represents the highest % of full-time students since spring 2012.

Students are actively enrolled in an average of 8.4 units



← 84.3% of students are from historically under-represented student populations, (last spring: 81.1%)

The % of female students has declined over the past three years (SP22: 62.7%; SP21: 63.9%), returning to the pre-pandemic level



← Mean student age has declined (24.6 last spring), driven in large part by the increase in dual enrollment students

Approx. 1/3 of all students reside outside of the Chaffey District boundaries, hailing from 365 unique statewide, national, and international cities
