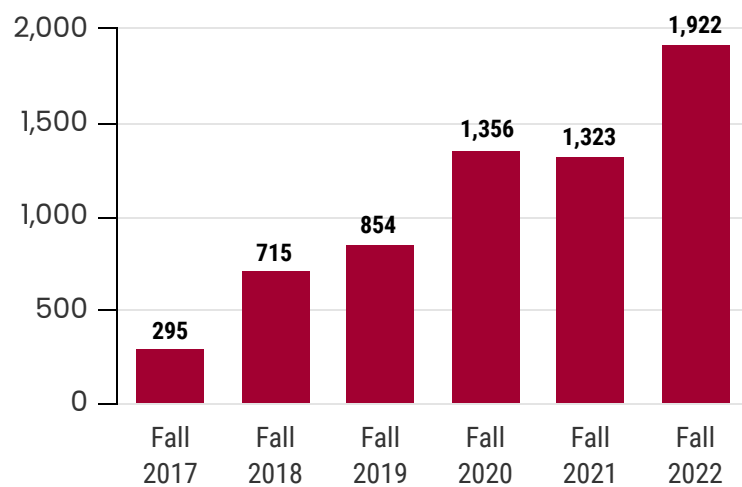


Dual Enrollment Student Outcomes Over the Past 6 Years

Overview: The Office of Institutional Research collaborated with Intersegmental Partnerships to examine Dual Enrollment student outcomes over the past six years. Dual Enrollment, also known as concurrent enrollment, enables high school students to take college courses while they are still in high school. Since Fall 2017, there has been a 551% increase in Dual Enrollment student headcount and success rates of Dual Enrollment students are consistently 8.6% to 14.5% higher than the general Chaffey College student population. Since Fall 2017, there has been a 41% increase in former Dual Enrollment student headcount and success rates of former Dual Enrollment students are 3.3% to 8.3% higher than the general Chaffey College student population. A former Dual Enrollment student is a previous Dual Enrollment student who returned to Chaffey College after completing their high school degree.

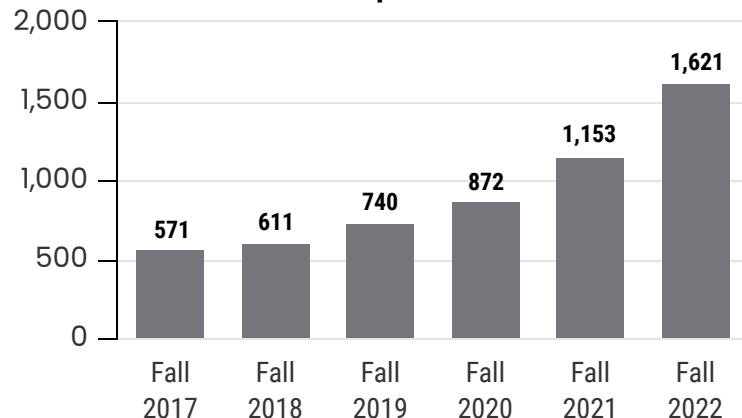
