

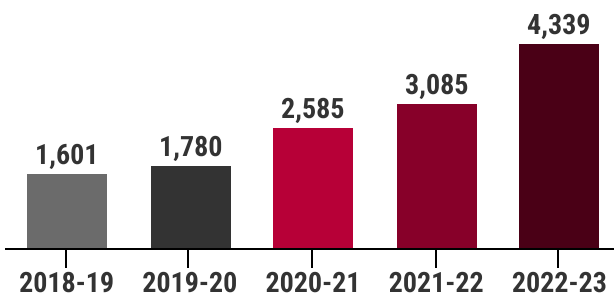

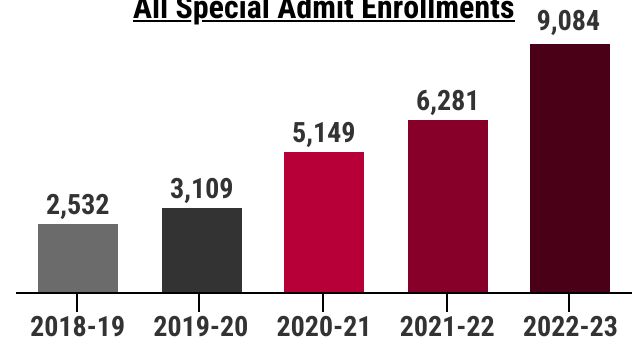
Special Admit Students

Overview: The Office of Institutional Research (OIR) identified special admit students who enrolled in one or more sections at Chaffey College over the past five years (i.e., from summer 2018 through spring 2023). "Special Admit" (also known as "Dual Enrollment") are students who are enrolled in high school or adult school, who have an overall grade point average of 2.00, and who are concurrently enrolled in one or more sections at Chaffey College. Special admit students can enroll in up to eleven units during primary terms and seven units during the summer semester. In addition to examining enrollments and course taking behavior, an online survey was developed to better understand high school Special Admit students perceptions of college and career pathways. The survey was completed by 787 high school Special Admit students.

Are High School Dual Enrollment Students Considering Chaffey College After High School?

51.5% are considering Chaffey College as a viable higher education option. Many students mentioned factors such as affordability, convenience, and familiarity with the institution.

38.0% are not considering Chaffey College as a higher education option. Their reasons include a preference for four-year university and aspirations for specific majors.

9.5% expressed uncertainty or lack of information about Chaffey College, indicating that they are still exploring their options.

Considering Chaffey College

- "Yes I am considering Chaffey College as a higher education option because they have many programs and resources."
- "Yes because it is close and a good school"
- "Yes, I am considering Chaffey College as a higher education option for the financial reasons - it will be much less expensive than a four-year university."

Not Considering Chaffey College

- "No, I want to move out and explore a world outside of California"
- "No, because I plan on going to a 4 year university"
- "No because I just want to attend a school that is more advanced to reflect all of the work I put in through high school."
