## A Brief List of College Priorities and Success Worth Noting

The College has collaboratively implemented many ongoing efforts and accomplishments over the last few years. We emphasize that this was a collective effort, and no one group is responsible for Chaffey's success. We are pleased to highlight some of them here.

**Post-Pandemic Plans:** Through our collective effort, we have provided enhanced academic and support services to students, helping them complete their academic and career goals despite persistent and unprecedented obstacles.

**Building Enrollment, Success, and Facilities:** Our enrollment numbers have rebounded to pre-pandemic levels, demonstrating our resilience and commitment to student success. Vibrant student life and engagement are exploding across the campuses. Measure P work is steadfast, and soon, we will be celebrating the opening of the new Chino instructional building and the new aquatics center, among many other facilities to come.

**Diversity and Inclusion:** We have made significant strides in building a campus community that supports and celebrates diversity, offering extremely competitive compensation and benefits, and building a workforce that helps students reach their goals.

#### 2024 – At A Glance

- Ranked No. 4 Best Community College in Region (WalletHub)
- Increased the number of full-time equivalent students from 15,115 to 16,604 in 2024
- Increased the number of night classes from 120 to 256 for fall 2024
- Increased the number served through Panther Care from 4,000 to 8,876 students

- Chaffey College introduced several new degree and certification programs over the last three years alone, including cloud security, physical therapist assistant, phlebotomy and more.
- We received reaffirmed accreditation from the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) for the next seven years. (2024)

- In Tech was awarded two \$1.3 million grants by the James Irvine Foundation (2019, 2021) as well as the COYA grant with \$1.2 million in apprenticeships support. (2024)
- Chaffey College drew the attention of several elected officials and dignitaries over the last few years, resulting in campus visits and stories from:

# STUDENT SERVICES AND STRATEGIC COMMUNICATIONS

- Chaffey College launched and hosted two successful Black and Brown Minds & Mattering Conference (2022, 2023), which united more than 1,000 community members, students, faculty and staff collectively. Our next conference is on October 30, 2024.
- We launched Mental Health and Student Wellness services with the hiring of social wellness and behavioral support staff to offer therapy sessions, mental health resources, risk assessments, crisis intervention and programming. (2023)
- The Campaign for College Opportunity named Chaffey College a 2021 Equity Champion of Higher Education.
- We launched PRISM center for LGBTQIA+ and Undocumented students a safe space that empowers these growing student communities. (2023)

### INSTITUTIONAL POINTS OF PRIDE

- We successfully passed Measure P in 2018, which provided \$700 million in funding to expand and modernize Chaffey campuses and infrastructure needs in 2018
  - Chino Instructional Building \$34.5 million (opening end of 2024)
  - Swimming Pool Renovation \$14.2 million (opening end of 2024)
  - Library/Learning Commons (LLC) \$75 million (under construction)
  - Michael Alexander Campus Center (MACC) Renovation \$19.9 million (under construction)
  - ADA Barrier Removal Project (Rancho & Chino Campuses)- \$10 million (Completed)
  - New Fontana Campus- \$210.6 million (Planning phase)
  - New Ontario Campus \$277 million (Planning phase)

- Chaffey College launched first annual community PRIDE celebration in June 2023.
- Chaffey College distributed more than \$35 million in direct aid to students and expended \$55 million in technology, stipends, and COVID-related support from HEERF Funds (2021-2024)
- Chaffey College received \$25 million gift from Philanthropist MacKenzie Scott (2021)
- Chaffey College leadership committed to regular town hall meetings each semester to improve communication via its 10-Point Plan (2021), which was designed to improve equity practices, and provide more institutional accountability to these efforts.
- Chaffey College conducted climate surveys for students and all employees (2021) and LGBTQIA+ students. (2024)
- Lavender Graduation for LGBTQIA+ was added to cultural graduation celebrations. (2020)
- Employment Recruitment Outcomes
  - 76% underrepresented employees selected for hire in 2023
  - o 67% underrepresented employees selected for hire in 2022
  - 61% underrepresented employees selected for hire in 2021
- The District maintains a strong fiscal position and fully funded the Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) account which supports retiree benefits (2024)
