Chaffey DoublesNight Courses for Fall

Chaffey College has more than doubled the number of evening class offerings for fall 2024, bringing students more options to meet their academic goals.

There are still opportunities to register for classes occurring between 4:30 and 10 p.m. on Chaffey's Chino, Fontana, and Rancho Cucamonga campuses for Fast Track II, which begins October 14.

"Many of our students work day jobs, but still desire a face-to-face classroom experience," said Chaffey College Interim Associate Superintendent of Instruction and Institutional Effectiveness Michael McClellan. "By offering courses after normal business hours, our students will be able to reach their goals in a way that fits into their schedules."

Chaffey rolled out 246 course sections at the start of registration, a 114 percent increase from fall 2023.

Students can complete numerous requirements for transfer and degrees with subjects such as biology, business, chemistry and communication studies. They can also pursue workforce education classes including automotive technology, firefighting and community health worker principles.

A wide variety of night classes will continue to be offered in future semesters, with the goal of giving all students access to flexible course schedules.

"We remain committed to equity at Chaffey College and by reducing barriers to access, more students will have an opportunity to improve their lives with a college education," McClellan said

Chaffey Celebrates Hispanic Heritage Month

Chaffey Community Gathers for Presidential Debate

Students, faculty and staff gathered to watch the second presidential debate on the Rancho Cucamonga campus on September 10.

The event – hosted by Student Life and the Center for Culture and Social Justice - gave students a chance to learn more about the candidates and the importance of voting.

"Younger generations are always characterized as being the voices of change and seeing the turnout of the attendance at the event made me very hopeful and optimistic for the future leaders that will have come out of that room," said Jayden Galvan, president of the Chaffey Speech and Debate Club.

The club, which facilitated the event, encouraged students to pay attention to the policies of each candidate so they know how they will be affected.

"We helped initiate conversation in the room about some of the issues concerning the students in our campus so that way we could pay close attention to the policies of each presidential candidate and see their stances on the issues that concern our community," Galvan said.

Debate Club Vice President Ethan Covarrubias, a psychology and pre-law student, said he was excited to see about 50 members of the campus community attend.

"I think the overall turnout could reflect the next step to increasing voting," he said.

The event also gave students a chance to exchange ideas and bond.

"I enjoyed the camaraderie of the event," Covarrubias said. "Being able to both speak and discuss expectations before and during the debate was a special moment that I won't forget."

Students Find Community at Fall Club Rush

From karaoke to crocheting and mental health to men's volleyball, students representing a wide variety of interests brought together thousands from the campus community for Fall Club Rush on August 28.

The event takes place twice a year, giving students a chance to join or create their own clubs on campus and connect with each other outside of the classroom.

Eleven clubs were chartered as of August 29, with another 25 working to gather more members to become officially chartered.

English major Brandon Croxford dreamed up the Karaoke Club as a way for students to express themselves. He's hoping he can gather enough likeminded singers to make the club official.

"Club meetings will most likely consist of discussing some of our favorite songs/music, what singing means to us, planning karaoke face-offs and singing our hearts out," he said.

Sarah Siddiqui, who is majoring in psychology, serves as president of the Chaffey Loves You Club. The club plans to focus on raising mental health awareness through presentations, workshops and guest speakers.

"Chaffey College has provided me with incredible support, especially EOPS, and I want to give back to this caring community," she said.

Many long-standing clubs such as Chaffey College Student Government, Game Development and Chaffey Dungeons and Dragons also attended the event to recruit new members.

Several unchartered reading and writing clubs joined the festivities, including the Book Club, the Books and Music Club, the Panther Poet Society and the Fiction Writing Club.

Among newcomers looking for charter status is WooSTEM, a group of female students majoring in Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics, and the Youth Innovation Collective.
