Instruction and Accreditation



What is Accreditation?

- **Six accrediting bodies exist nationwide**
- **Chaffey College is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior College (ACCJC)**
- **ACCJC is recognized by the U.S. Dept. of Education and oversees California, Hawaii, and territories and islands in the Pacific**
- **ACCJC evaluates and accredits public and private postsecondary institutions that offer two-year programs and award associate degrees**

What happens during Accreditation?

- **Accreditation is a seven-year cyclical review process. Chaffey's next Accreditation visit will occur in 2023.**
- **The purpose of Accreditation is to encourage institutions to engage in and improve:**
 - **Academic Quality**
 - **Institutional Effectiveness**
 - **Student Success**
- **To accomplish this purpose, ACCJC has created:**
 - **Accreditation Standards**
 - **A peer evaluation process to review implementation of and adherence to Accreditation Standards**

The Accreditation Process

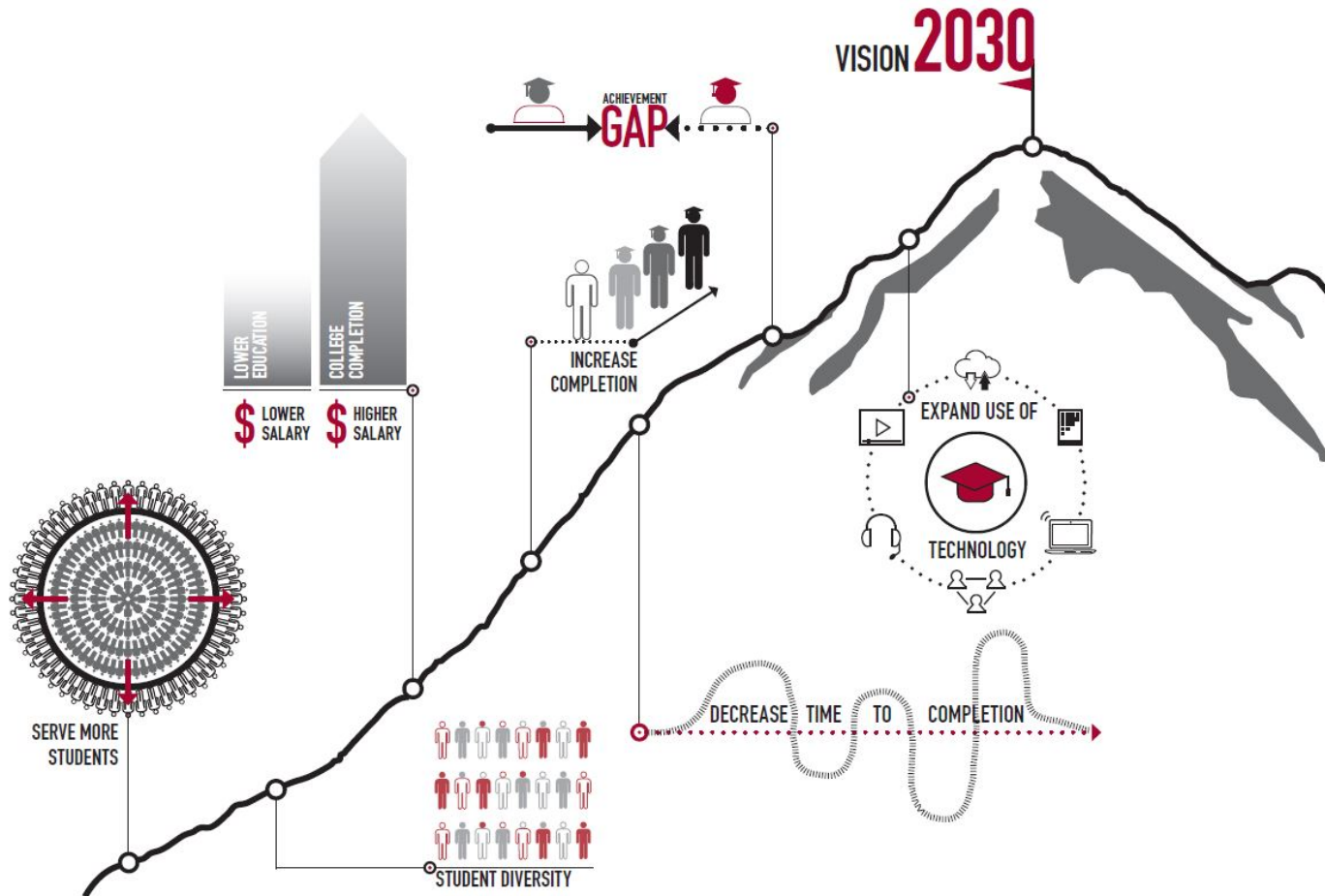
- **The main focal point of Accreditation is the Institutional Self-Evaluation Report (ISER). The ISER addresses four standards:**
 - **Mission, Academic Quality, Instructional Effectiveness, & Integrity**
 - **Student Learning, Programs, and Services**
 - **Resources**
 - **Leadership and Governance**

- **Other reports and reviews include:**
 - **A mid-term report, due in the 4th year of the cycle**
 - **Quality Focus Essay (QFE)**
 - **Annual institutional and financial reports**
 - **Substantive Change Report (as needed)**

The Governing Board's Role In Accreditation

 - Leadership and Governance (Standard IV.C)

Education Master Plan (EMP)



Educational Master Plan

- **Creates an educational vision for 2030 and beyond**

- **Purpose:**
 - **Establishes institutional goals (“Chaffey Goals”)**
 - **Foster the use of data, inquiry, and evaluation to identify major challenges and opportunities**
 - **Analyze the relevant College and community factors that impact each College campus**
 - **Provides a foundation for short-term planning**
 - **Informs the College’s intentions and garners support for the services provided in and to the community**

Chaffey Goals

- **Equity and Success** - Chaffey College will be an equity-driven college that fosters success for all students.
- **Learning and Completion** - Chaffey College will ensure learning and timely completion of students' educational goals.
- **Community Opportunities and Needs** - Chaffey College will develop and maintain programs and services that maximize students' opportunities and reflect community needs.
- **Technology** - Chaffey College will optimize the use of technological tools and infrastructure to advance institutional efficiency and student learning.

Chaffey Goals

- **Efficiency** - Chaffey College will efficiently and effectively manage systems, processes, and resources to maximize capacity.
- **Agility** - Chaffey College will responsively adapt to changes in students' academic and career needs.
- **Professional Learning** - Chaffey College will prioritize and align professional learning for all employees to support the achievement of Chaffey Goals.

What are Policies?

What are Procedures?

- **Policies represent the “what” while administrative procedures identify the “how”**
 - **Policies** – voice of the governing board; defines the general goals and acceptable practices for the operations of the district; implements federal and state laws and regulations
 - **Administrative Procedures** – implement board policy, laws, and regulations; address how the general goals of the district are achieved and define the operations of the district

Local Review Process

- Area content expert(s) review draft language; if the policy/procedure falls under academic and professional matters (“10+2”) it is first sent to Faculty Senate for review
- Taken to President’s Cabinet for first read and review. Cabinet members sunshine with constituency groups
- Recommendations are reviewed and synthesized into documents
- Policies/procedures returned to President’s Cabinet for second read and approval. Approved procedures posted to web.
- Policies are reviewed with the Governing Board Liaison
- Policies are lodged with the Governing Board for first read/information (1st month) and adoption (following month)
